

Respiratory Illness Report - Week ending May 4, 2024

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Overview

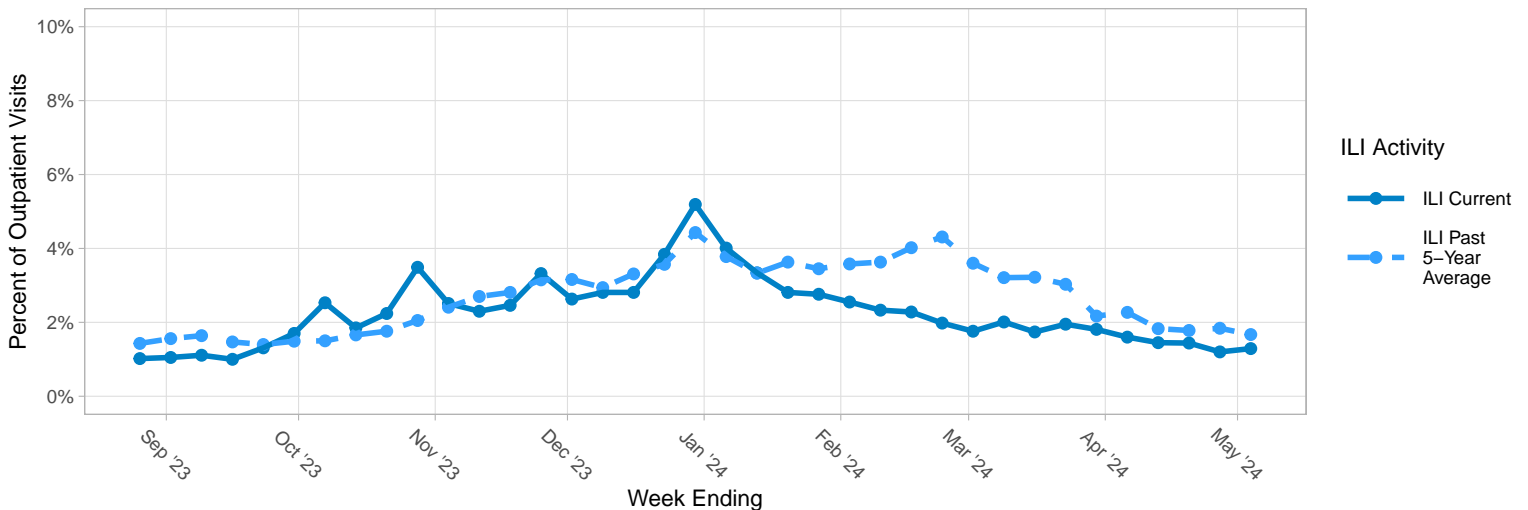
Influenza: Statewide influenza-like illness (ILI) and hospitalization rates in Utah remain in low severity. In Davis County, current ILI rates remained in minimal severity. Seasonal influenza activity continues to decline nationally and in most areas of the country.

COVID-19 Wastewater Surveillance: As of April 30, overall statewide viral concentrations in wastewater are low. There are zero sites (0.0%) in the Elevated category, four sites (11.4%) in the Watch category, and 31 sites (88.6%) in the Low category. In Davis County, the South Davis – North site (Woods Cross/Bountiful/West Bountiful/Centerville area) increased to the Watch category. The other three sites all remained in the Low category. Influenza-Like Illness

Graph 1 displays the weekly percentage of outpatient visits due to influenza-like illness (ILI). For comparison, the dashed line shows the previous 5-year average (2018-2022) of ILI activity. This week's ILI rate was 1.3%.

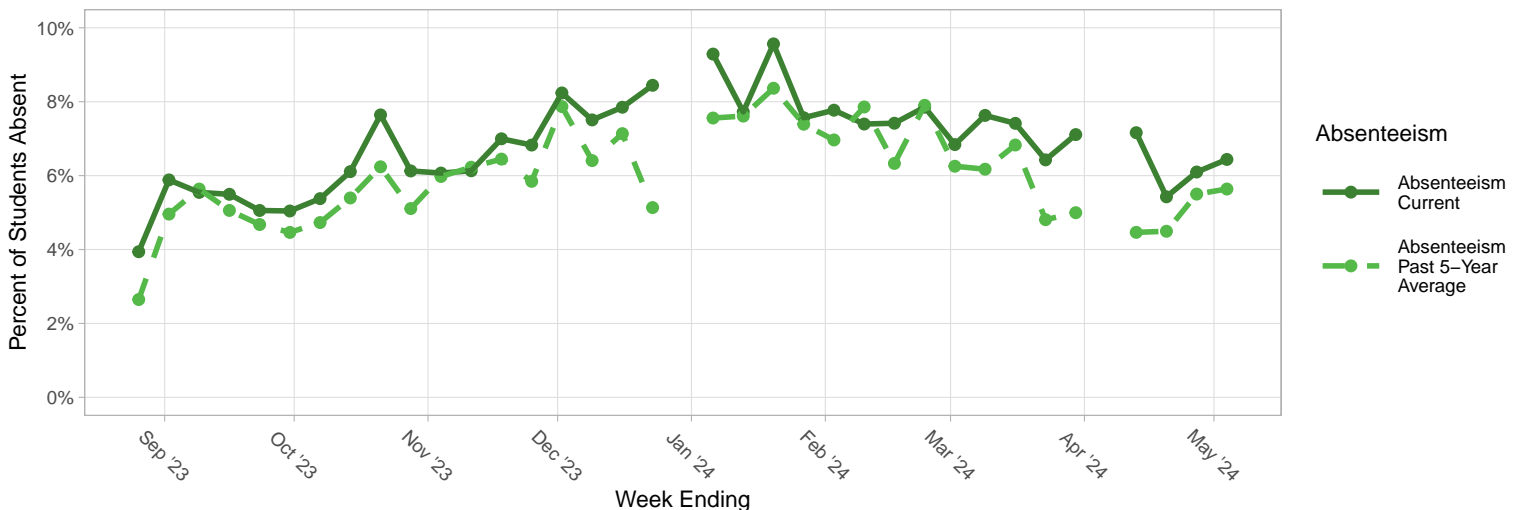
Graph 1. Percent of Outpatient Visits due to Influenza-Like Illness, by Week, Davis County, Utah



School Absenteeism

Graph 2 displays the weekly percentage of elementary school absenteeism in Davis School District. For comparison, the dashed line shows the absenteeism rate of the previous 5 school years (school years beginning 2018-2022). This week's absenteeism rate was 6.4%.

Emergency Department Visits

Graph 3 displays the rolling 7 day average of the percent of emergency department (ED) visits due to COVID-19, influenza, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). These data are obtained from syndromic surveillance and only consider the diagnosis discharge codes for each condition. Table 1 presents two data points for each virus: the current trend of ED visits (increasing, decreasing, or no change), and the percent of ED visits due to each during the currently reported week.

Graph 3. Percent of ED Visits due to COVID-19, Influenza, & RSV, Rolling 7-day Average, Davis County, Utah

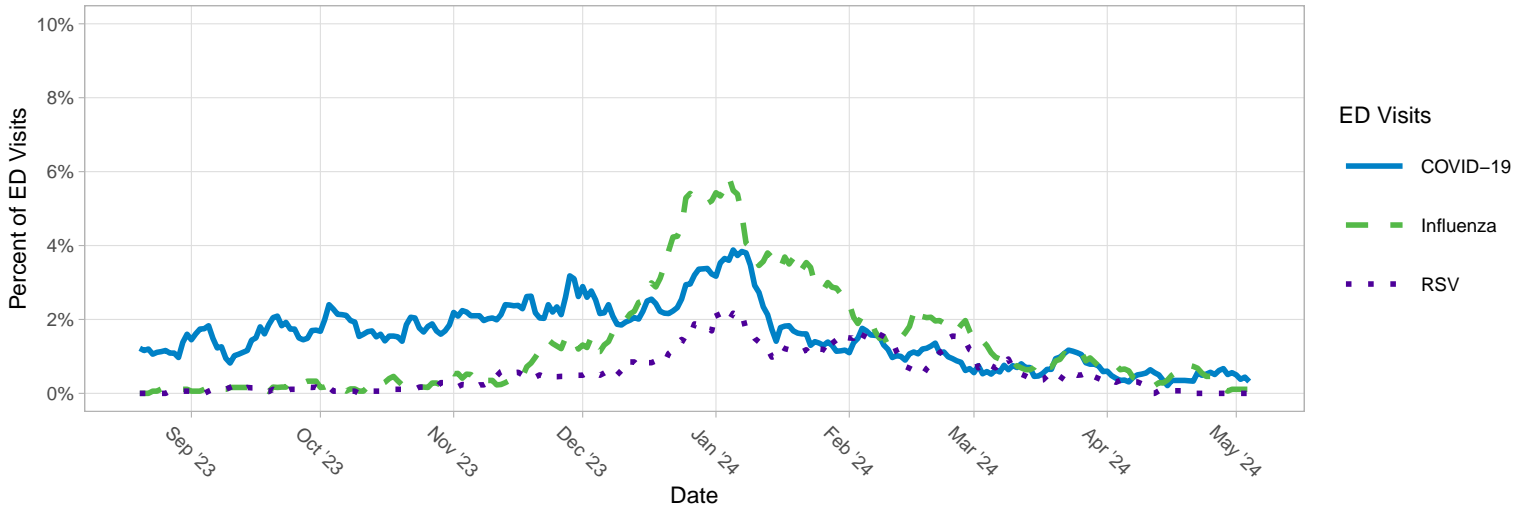
