

Respiratory Illness Report - Week ending January 27, 2024

Overview



Influenza: Statewide influenza-like illness (ILI) and hospitalization rates both remained in low severity this week. In Davis County, current ILI rates also remained in minimal severity. Nationwide, seasonal influenza activity remains elevated with increases in some parts of the country.

COVID-19 Wastewater Surveillance: As of January 25, overall statewide viral concentrations in wastewater remain high, but with some decreasing trends. There are with 29 sites (85.3%) in the Elevated category (a decrease of 3 sites from last week). In Davis County, three sites are in the Elevated category. One site, South Davis - South (North Salt Lake area), decreased to the Watch category. Explore statewide wastewater surveillance data at https://avrpublic.dhhs.utah.gov/uwss/.

Influenza-Like Illness


Graph 1 displays the weekly percentage of outpatient visits due to influenza-like illness (ILI). For comparison, the dashed line shows the previous 5-year average (2018-2022) of ILI activity. This week's ILI rate was 2.8%.



Graph 1. Percent of Outpatient Visits due to Influenza-Like Illness, by Week, Davis County, Utah


School Absenteeism

Graph 2 displays the weekly percentage of elementary school absenteeism in Davis School District. For comparison, the dashed line shows the absenteeism rate of the previous 5 school years (school years beginning 2018-2022). This week's absenteeism rate was 7.6%.



Emergency Department Visits

Graph 3 displays the rolling 7 day average of the percent of emergency department (ED) visits due to COVID-19, influenza, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). These data are obtained from syndromic surveillance and only consider the diagnosis discharge codes for each condition. Table 1 presents two data points for each virus: the current trend of ED visits (increasing, decreasing, or no change), and the percent of ED visits due to each during the currently reported week.
