

Respiratory Illness Report - Week ending November 9, 2024

Overview

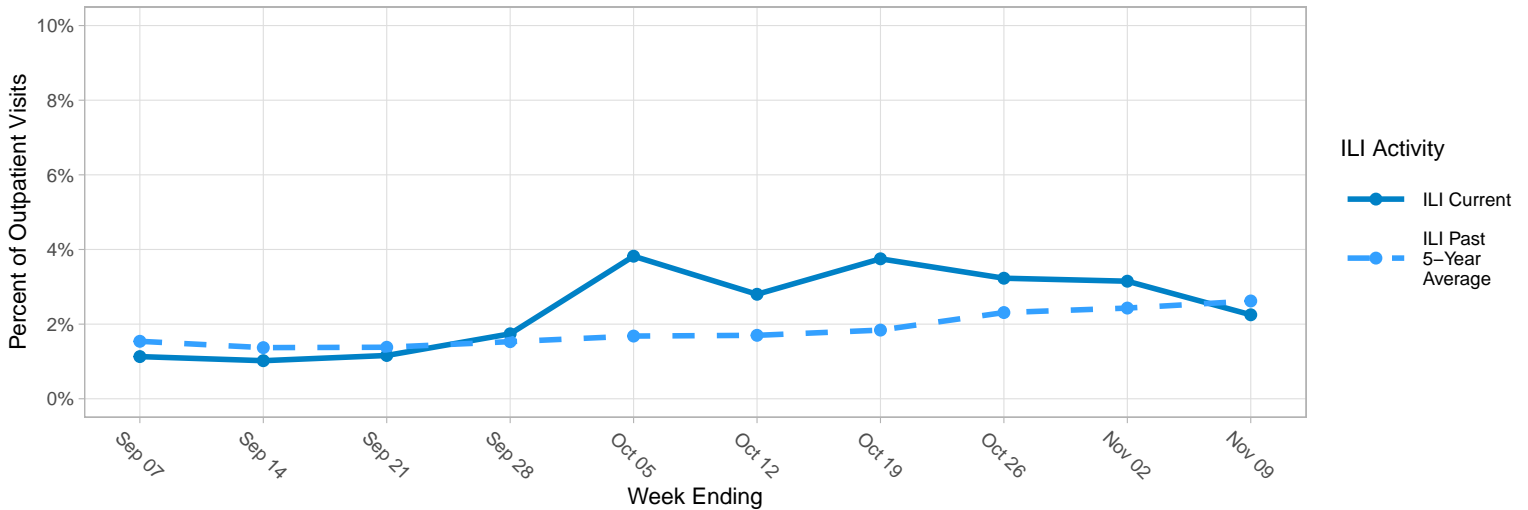
Influenza: Nationwide, seasonal influenza activity is increasing slightly among children, but remains low nationally. In Utah, influenza-like illness (ILI) and influenza hospitalizations are in low severity across the state. In Davis County, ILI activity is classified as minimal.

COVID-19 Wastewater Surveillance: As of November 7, overall statewide viral concentrations of SARS-CoV-2 in wastewater have remained stable over the last week. There are four sites (11.4%) in the Elevated category, 14 sites (40.0%) in the Watch category, and 17 sites (48.6%) in the Low category. In Davis County, only the South Davis – North site (Bountiful/Centerville/Woods Cross/West Bountiful area) is in the Low category. The remaining three sites are all in the Watch category, with increasing trends at the North Davis site (Layton/Clearfield/Syracuse/West Point area). Influenza-Like Illness

Graph 1 displays the weekly percentage of outpatient visits due to influenza-like illness (ILI). For comparison, the dashed line shows the previous 5-year average (2019-2023) of ILI activity. This week's ILI rate was 2.2%.

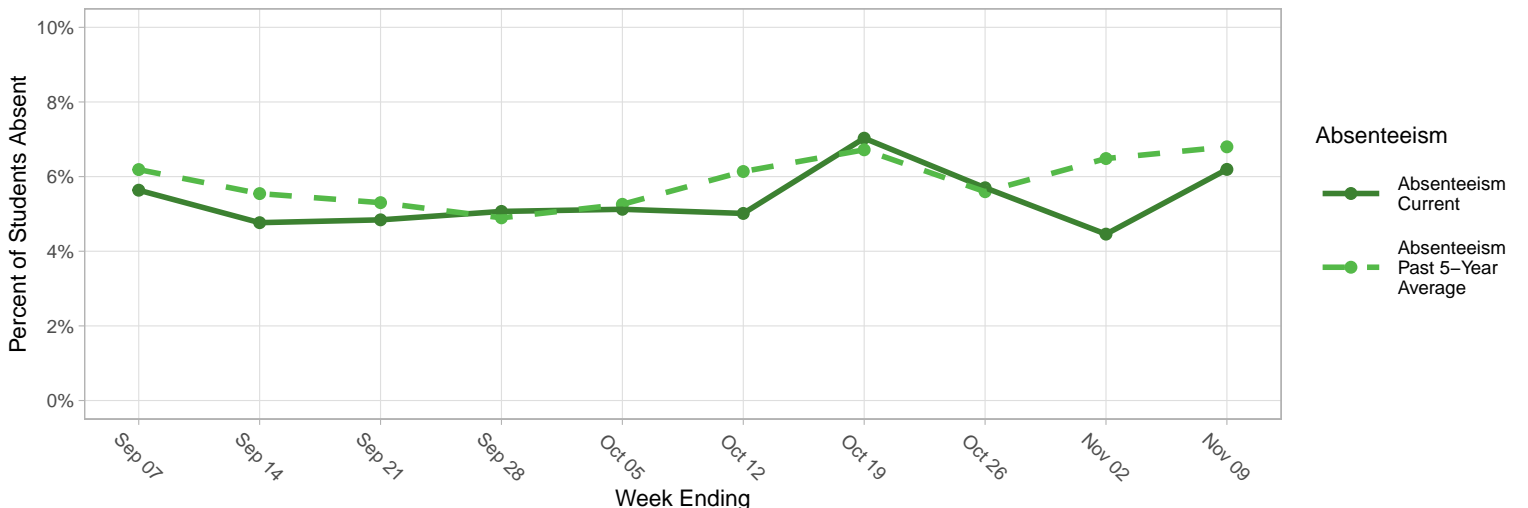
Graph 1. Percent of Outpatient Visits due to Influenza-Like Illness, by Week, Davis County, Utah



School Absenteeism

Graph 2 displays the weekly percentage of elementary school absenteeism in Davis School District. For comparison, the dashed line shows the absenteeism rate of the previous 5 school years (school years beginning 2019-2023). This week's absenteeism rate was 6.2%.

Emergency Department Visits

Graph 3 displays the rolling 7 day average of the percent of emergency department (ED) visits due to COVID-19, influenza, and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). These data are obtained from syndromic surveillance and only consider the diagnosis discharge codes for each condition. Table 1 presents two data points for each virus: the current trend of ED visits (increasing, decreasing, or no change), and the percent of ED visits due to each during the currently reported week.

Graph 3. Percent of ED Visits due to COVID-19, Influenza, & RSV, Rolling 7-day Average, Davis County, Utah

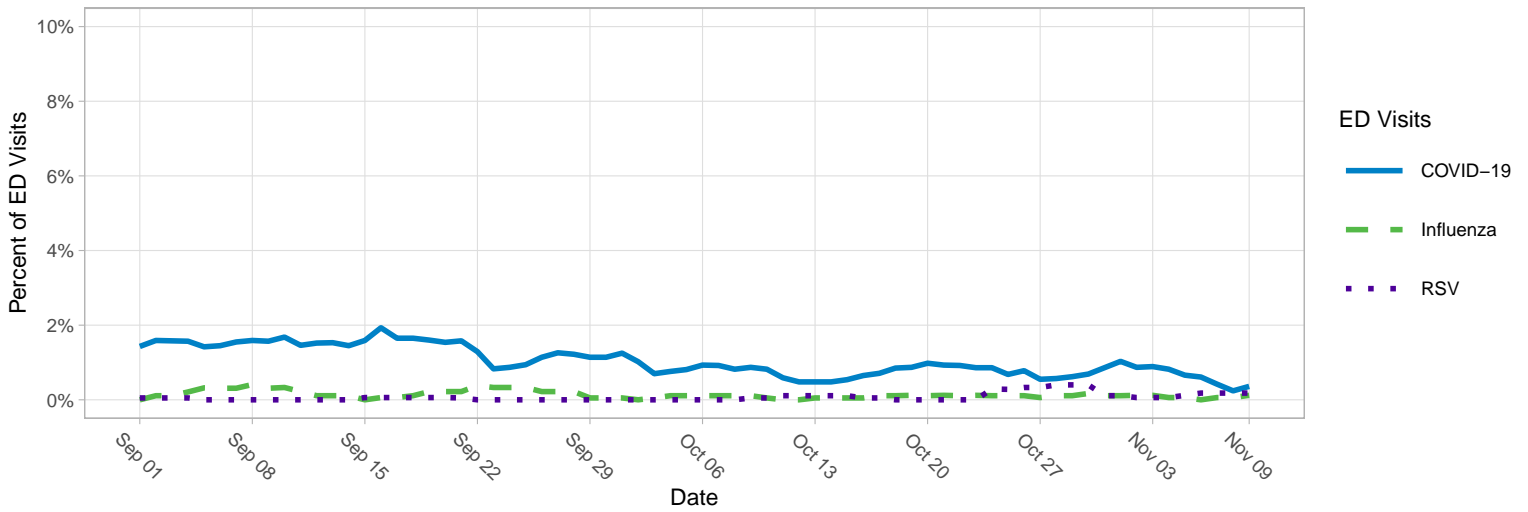

Virus	Trend	Percent of ED Visits
COVID-19	Decreasing (last 7 days)	0.4 %
Influenza	Plateau/no trend (last 14 days)	0.1 %
RSV	Increasing (last 7 days)	0.2 %
