## DAVIS COUNTY BUSINESS REQUIREMENTS

EFFECTIVE APRIL 1 - MAY 1, 2020

### ALL BUSINESSES & ORGANIZATIONS

If employees must work, employers should:

- Allow work from home whenever possible
- Exclude employees with fever, coughing, or shortness of breath
- Ensure 6 feet of social distancing among staff & public
- Limit in-person operations to essential staff
- Prohibit customers with signs & symptoms of illness
- Require regular & frequent handwashing
- Sanitize high-touch surfaces frequently
- Minimize customer interactions
- Utilize drive-thru options or appointments when possible
- Monitor for group gatherings & intervene quickly

### FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS

In addition to requirements for all businesses, food establishments must:

- Monitor & exclude staff for any signs & symptoms of illness
- Practice 6 feet of social distancing
- Prohibit dine-in services, inside & outside
- Encourage remote orders & payments
- Restrict employees who handle payment from food service
- Clean payment devices between transactions
- Engage in regular & frequent handwashing

### CLOSED

The following facilities shall be closed based on their inability to observe the social distancing necessary to slow the spread of COVID-19:

- All salons & spas
- Tattoo & piercing shops
- Permanent makeup services
- Swimming pools & splash pads
- Amusement parks
- Arcades & bowling alleys
- Movie theaters
- Playgrounds
- Recreation centers
- Gyms & fitness centers
- Performance, event, & reception venues
- Indoor play centers
- Social clubs
- Museums, aquariums, & zoos

*In order to effectively slow the spread of COVID-19, compliance of these requirements is **expected** for all individuals and businesses. Penalties for any violation will be considered.*
