Introductions to Other Pets

- Keep pets separated at first
- Slowly let them see and smell each other
- Supervise a face-toface introduction.
 This process can take time!



Exercise/Mental Stimulation

Exercise can help your cat maintain a healthy weight. It's also a great way to bond with your feline friend. Food puzzles, interactive toys, and supervised outdoor walks are all fun activities for your cat.



Transition Time

Give your cat 2-4 weeks to adjust to a new environment. Provide a quiet place for them to decompress.

LITTER BOX BEST PRACTICES

A simple guide for having your cat use the litter box.

Types of Boxes




Size makes a difference! The box should be large enough for your cat to move around inside comfortably.

We recommend a large, uncovered litter box.

We recommend non-scented litters. Cats have a keen sense of smell and may not like the scent that you choose!



Keeping Tidy



Litter boxes should be scooped daily. Once a week, wash the litter box with a mild soap or enzymatic cleaner.

Accidents can happen when a cat is stressed. This can include a new baby, new pet, moving, or a schedule change.

Make sure your kitty has a place they feel safe!
