Sandbags left exposed to the sun for an extended period of time degrade, so as soon as there is no longer an active flood threat to your property, sandbags need to be removed and disposed of properly. **DO NOT** dump sandbags in creeks, rivers, canals, ditches, roadway gutters, or storm drain inlets, as this could lead to future flooding complications for you or your neighbors.

Sand or sandbags that have only come into contact with rain, but not floodwater, can be reused without restriction in gardens, flower beds, sandboxes and playgrounds, as the base for paving blocks, or for snow and ice control.

Sand or sandbags exposed to floodwater could be contaminated with sewage, pathogens, and chemicals and should not be reused in ways where they might come into contact with people or pets.
