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New Website Helps Community Members Find **Local Resources**

Davis Links makes it easier to access trusted resources in one place.

DAVIS COUNTY, UTAH – Davis County Health Department has launched a new online tool to help community members find trusted resources in one place. The Davis Links Resource Directory website is davislinks.org. It is a one-stop source with over 2,000 programs and services for all stages of life. Users can access resources for food, housing, healthcare, behavioral health, family support, overall well-being, and more, just by entering a keyword and their ZIP code.

“Davis County service providers are excited to start bringing awareness to Davis Links, which connects our community to a comprehensive and vital network of resources,” said Davis County Health Department Director Brian Hatch.

Davis Links connects everyone in Davis County to trusted resources and local support through a network that is efficient and reliable. Users can search privately with no account required. Those who want to save or return to their search later can create a free account. The website is available in more than 130 languages.

“Finding the right help can be challenging. Davis Links helps close the gap between needs and available support. It turns searching into finding and eases the stress of seeking help,” said Open Doors Executive Director Jason Wilde.

This new tool is part of a countywide effort to improve access to resources and services. The Davis Links Resource Directory is powered by findhelp, a social care platform. Service providers and the community have access to local resources through the platform. The website is a community-driven initiative championed by Davis4Health and trusted Davis County Human

Services agencies, representing a major collaborative effort between county government and community partners.

“There has been a gap in community members' awareness about services, assistance, care, help, and opportunities that are available and where to find them. By increasing awareness and simplifying access to resources, we are addressing a community theme that has been repeated many times over the last decade,” said Isa Perry, Health Strategy Manager at the Davis County Health Department. “Through this effort, we are reducing barriers, facilitating connections, and contributing to a stronger, more resilient Davis County.”

“Community members and service providers across Davis County have long called for a shared, up-to-date resource directory to support families and individuals through life's challenges. Davis Links is the result of a vision for a community where everyone feels connected, supported, and empowered by a trusted network of care,” said Davis County Domestic Violence Coalition Chair Debbie Comstock. “Davis Links is also a hub for those in Davis County who are looking for ways to be part of the solution. We’re proud to support this tool and hope everyone will join us in using and promoting it.”
