Disease Matters

Severe Lung Illness related to Vaping

Background

Since March 31, 2019, approximately 805 cases of severe lung illness associated with ecigarette or vaping products have been reported nationwide. This includes 12 confirmed deaths in 10 states. As of Monday, September 30, 2019, 71 cases of vaping-related lung disease have been reported in Utah (See Table1).



Among Utah cases, 90% have been hospitalized, with more than half of those being admitted to an intensive care unit (ICU) and some requiring the assistance of ventilators to help them breathe.

Signs and Symptoms

Patients are presenting with respiratory symptoms including cough, shortness of breath, chest pain, and fatigue. Some patients also report nausea and vomiting. Symptoms are often progressive and worsen over a period of days or weeks prior to hospital admission.

Chest radiographs show bilateral opacities and CT imaging of the chest often show diffuse ground-glass opacities. Evaluation for infectious etiologies is negative among almost all patients.

Exposures and Acquisition

While all reported cases have reported a history of vaping, the investigation has not identified any specific product or substance that is linked to all cases. Most patients, however, have reported vaping products that contain THC.

Seasonal Matters

West Nile Virus Season Update

Increased rainfall during this past spring and summer season led to increased mosquito populations. Unfortunately, it also led to mosquito pools positive for West Nile virus.

Positive pools were detected throughout the state, but Davis County had a higher number of positive pools than most areas in the state. Throughout the season, 92 positive mosquito pools were lab-confirmed in Davis County, with the peak number of pools occurring mid-August.

Despite the high number of positive pools, fewer than five human cases were reported in Davis County this season. At least one case reported mosquito exposure while visiting other parts of Utah. None of these cases were determined to be neuroinvasive and all infected individuals recovered from the infection.
